

MANOR HIGH SCHEDULING PROCESS BEGINS

Manor High School counselors and administrators welcome all parents, guardians, students and interested parties to attend an informational scheduling session for all grade levels of MHS, Tuesday evening, April 1, 6:30 PM. Specific support will be in place for the graduates of 2011 and 2012. These students will be required to complete four years of math and science, along with the previously required four years of English, and four years of social studies combined with and half year of economics. Careful planning will allow students to continue to enjoy elective courses such as band, sports, theatre, art, dance, and Career and Technology courses. "The new state requirement of additional math and science courses will have an affect on our students' schedules and it is important that parents and students have all the information to make the best choices. We will continue to schedule meetings with eighth grade parents to raise awareness early on," stated interim superintendent, Andrew Kim.

Manor ISD supports students under the new graduation requirements by offering summer courses for accelerated credit. Information regarding the opportunity for all 2008-2009 freshmen and sophomores to take summer courses will be communicated Tuesday evening and through all classroom scheduling sessions.

Choosing the right courses provides a solid foundation for success after high school. The 2008-2009 Course Guide provides valuable information regarding policies, procedures, and course offerings. All are encouraged to attend this Question & Answer format presentation. Students who attend will be able to complete the course registration process.

MHS Counselors will continue to provide information about the course selection process, class choices, and graduation plans through classroom guidance sessions at Manor Middle School and MHS scheduled throughout the school day for the first two weeks in April. Students will be given a course selection guide and choice sheet. Classroom instructors will provide additional course information for students through the selection process. Counselors will return to classrooms to conference with students individually and to confirm course selections. Each student will be mailed a verification of course requests along with a deadline for change requests. Students and parents are encouraged to seek individual support from MHS counselors at any time during the scheduling process by calling 278-4800.
