7th and 8th-grade abstinence plus contraception

Clarified the acronym SEL - Social Emotional Learning

Arie discussed how to implement the program in a way that does not seem punitive to those opting in—separating from students who opted out. All elementary school teachers will be trained between April 4-18

Discussed whole child partnerships

New partnership with Explore Austin Mentoring program for 7th and 8th graders

Discussed program implementation. The free program provides students with traveling opportunities.

Becky Rivera discussed pregnancy-related services.

Discussed the number of pregnant students in the district within the past five years

- 2018-2019 6 pregnant students
- 2019-2020 6 pregnant students
- 2020-2021 19 pregnant students
- 2021- 2022 8 students pregnant this year

Becky Rivera discussed the role in pregnancy-related services for students and homebound services for six weeks after birth.

Discussed the number of students using district daycare (3)

Discussed number of students in foster care throughout the district (42)

Discussed role in helping foster care students and parents who need assistance.

Discussed Manor Mustang Clinic as a separate entity from Whole Child

Nancy Zavelata introduced herself from Manor Mustang Clinic

Jessica Layssard introduced herself and discussed the campuses she serves.

Discussed roles on campuses. Connecting community partnerships, working with campus nurses for medical needs, attending student support team meetings.

Kristen Turpin's introduction discussed campuses she serves and roles. Discussed increase in out-cry needs and working with families experiencing deportations.

Katie Lewin's introduction and roles are supporting staff with resources. Social skills for students. Helping to fill gaps in the school's such lunch duty, etc. Home visits.

Vanessa Staley New family engagement coordinator. Discussed roles such as working with parent liaisons, Mentor Manor program restarting in 2-3 weeks

V. COVID-19 Updates- Diana Rios Rodriguez discussed COVID vaccine clinics

17 vaccine clinics in Manor, Given 1081 vaccines of those 305 were 5 to 11 year old

Manor ISD will be hosting a vaccination clinic every three weeks at MNTHS cafeteria

- Discussed case counts and sanitation protocols
- Discussed Curative Partnership. Open 8-6. Capped appt at 200 daily
- Discussed new Manor ISD testing site
- Discussed effort to get vaccination information out to the community
- Discussed New Health and Wellness Facebook page
- Grant-funded new manor testing site only for scholars and staff
- Exploring options to expand testing capabilities to include family
- Flyers available in English and Spanish
